SAFETY INFORMATION AND REMINDERS

Helmets: CanSkate participants (kids *and* adults) must wear a CSA approved helmet up to and including badge level 5.

(Bike helmets and non-CSA approved ski/board helmets are not accepted.)

Remain in the rink! A quick reminder that parents of CanSkaters must remain in the rink in case your child needs assistance. It is a common occurrence that children need a drink of water, a skate adjustment or a bathroom break and it is the parents' responsibility to help their child as our coaches and program assistants are required to remain on the ice with the skaters. It is also critical that parents remain rink side in the unlikely and unfortunate event of an injury.

There's an app for that! Skate Canada's Concussion Ed App is a great resource and tool to learn about, and monitor concussions. We of course hope that nobody will have to use it, but we encourage all parents and/or skaters to download it and familiarize yourself with it just in case!
